GO-KARTING KING—BRAITH MURDOCK

Netherhall School year 7 student Braith Murdock is a go-karting superstar. Last weekend, Braith travelled seven hours to race in the British Go-karting (BKR) national series at the Llandow Circuit in Wales.

In preparation for the races, Braith practised both on Friday and Saturday, and then qualified in the heats to progress through to the next round of heats on the Sunday and eventually in to the final. Throughout the practice sessions and the heats, Braith maintained a brilliant pace, getting quicker with each lap, whilst all the time learning the track and familiarising himself with the new kart set up. Braith's qualifying laps went superbly well, as he was out-front setting his own best times and eventually qualifying 5th out of 23 racers on the grid.

On Saturday, in heat 1, Braith started at 5th on the grid, but was soon into 2nd after some great battles throughout the race he eventually finished 2nd.

On Sunday, in heat 2, Braith missed the start and under pressure to make the places back, he out-broke himself and spun out, leaving him dead-last in the race at this point; however, undeterred, showing great courage and resilience, Braith got his head down and with some outstanding overtaking, Braith managed to work his way to a very respectable finishing position of 10th.

In heat 3, Braith was determined to make up for his earlier mistake, achieving a great start and battling all the way through the race to finish third in this heat.

In the final, Braith battled from the very start with the other front-runner, which was brilliant to watch. Braith crossed the line in second place; however, in the post-race scrutineering the winner was disqualified for non-compliance and Braith was rightfully promoted to 1st place!

This was only Braith's 4th race in this new kart with the Rotax engine, with many of the other racers having had the benefit of racing in this class for up to sixteen months, and with many of the other racers age 13 too; so for Braith to have achieved this and won the race demonstrates how brilliantly Braith is performing.

For the rest of the racing season, there are three big races left, in Lincolnshire, Dorset and Daventry, so it is very exciting to see how well Braith can do in these remaining races. 'Lady Supremacy' are World Champions!

It is with great joy that I write to tell you that 'Lady Supremacy' of the Cheer Force Knights Maryport cheerleading team, featuring a number of our very own Netherhall School students, have been crowned world champions at The Summit and Allstar World International Cheer Competition held in Orlando, Florida, USA.

Lucy Scott in year 13, Lucie Parker in year 8, Lola Graham and Evie Sowerby, both in year 7, embarked on the trip of a lifetime, arriving in Orlando, Florida on Monday, 24th April, where they stayed until the glorious conclusion of their trip and return to a heroes' reception in Maryport on Tuesday, 8th May. The girls told me they stayed in a huge villa in Orlando, accompanied by their parents, and have had the time of their lives – an experience they will never forget.

In the first week of the international competition, three of the girls, who competed as 'Lady Supremacy', Lucie Parker in year 8, along with Lola Graham and Evie Sowerby in year 7, took part in The Summit Competition, where they were the only UK team to make it through to the final, and following an incredible performance, they finished in 6th place. The best, however, was still to come!

In the second week of the competition, known as the Allstar World Championship, two teams from the Cheer Force Knights Maryport were entered in different divisions, with both teams making it through to the final of their respective competitions. In an incredible performance from 'Miss Reign', featuring Lucy Scott in year 13, Lucie Parker in year 8 and Lola Graham in year 7, a superb final routine saw the girls finish the competition as silver medalists. Incredibly, an even greater achievement was still to follow, when the 'Lady Supremacy' team of 15 superstar athletes, including Lucie Parker in year 8, Lola Graham and Evie Sowerby in year 7, competing in the Junior Extra Small Level 2 World Championship against 87 other teams, including those from the USA, Japan, Australia, Canada and five teams from the UK, produced an absolutely sensational final performance, resulting in 'Lady Supremacy' being crowned as the champions of the world!

Following the girls' return to Netherhall School this week, I had the pleasure of interviewing the world champions, who told me they have been preparing for this competition and routine for the last year, and that all of the hard work they have put in has well and truly paid off. The girls were quick to praise the hard work and dedication of their coaches, former Netherhall School students Olivia Scholey and Ellie Dempster, along with Molly Neen; without their dedication and commitment to the girls of 'Lady Supremacy' and 'Miss Reign', this magnificent achievement would not have been possible. The girls were also quick to pay tribute to their parents, who have supported them on every step of the journey, and told me they are lucky to have parents who have enabled them to make their dreams come true. They wanted me to let everyone know that without the support of their coaches and parents: "We wouldn't be where we are today – world champions!"

The girls made a triumphant return to Maryport at 3.30pm on Tuesday this week, when hundreds of supporters turned out to cheer their return at Netherhall Corner, along Whitecroft and awaiting their arrival at the gym where the year of dedicated training had been undertaken to secure this incredible final result. The girls said they felt like celebrities and that people haven't stopped congratulating them on their magnificent achievement since their return.

Netherhall School could not be prouder of the achievements of all four of the girls who took part in the competition, not only are they world class athletes and champions, but they are also magnificent students who are performing brilliantly in their studies at school. Lucy Scott in year 13 is just completing her A level studies in biology, chemistry and mathematics, and will take up her place to read for a degree in veterinary science at Liverpool University in the autumn, while Lucie Parker in year 8, Lola Graham and Evie Soweby in year 7 have all made an incredible start to their academic studies at Netherhall School; they are all amazing young ladies who are outstanding role models to all of the students of the school, proving that with dedication and commitment, the young people of Maryport are capable of truly world class achievements.

I would like to take this opportunity to congratulate these four incredible students on all they have achieved, and to let them know on behalf of the school and the Maryport community how proud we all are of them. It will be incredible to see the many successes the girls go on to achieve in the years ahead, and the girls should all be incredibly proud of the joy they have brought to their families, to our school, to Maryport, to West Cumbria, and indeed to the whole of the UK. Well done girls, you truly represent the very best of the young people of Maryport.

Finally, I would like to leave the last word to the world champions themselves:

"My experience in Florida was so good, not only did we make the best memories with our friends, we made history for our Maryport community. It was so good coming home and seeing all of the support we have had and seeing how many people have been with us on our journey. Being crowned world champions was beyond our expectations, and to also be awarded a silver medal topped it all off. We definitely couldn't have done it without our coaches; they put so much work into this moment and it definitely paid off. It was of course hard work, as we spent a lot of time training, but getting the chance to train in some of the big gyms in America was an amazing experience too and it was definitely all worth it; the trip ended on a massive high and I loved every second of it. Who knows what's to come, hopefully we will get the chance to go to America again!" **Lucie Parker, year 8.**

"It was a great experience. To be a world champion at 11 is amazing and I couldn't have done it without my coaches. It was really hard work to be dedicated to the team and we train all the time, but it had a great outcome. Hopefully we will get to have this experience again." **Lola Graham, year 7.**

"It has been an amazing experience being selected to be in an international cheer team competition. We have all worked so hard, training daily for months to get to this level, and our whole trip has been amazing. When we got through to the final we were all over the moon, as we were in the top 5 teams, so we knew we had to make the next performance our best. We work so well as a team and to become world champions means the world to us; it is amazing to know how proud everyone is of us." **Evie Sowerby, year 7.**

"Words cannot describe the experience that I've just had, and I feel privileged to have been a part of something that has made history for Cheer Force Knights Maryport and Maryport as a town. We cannot thank the community enough for all of the support that it has given us - it was a shock for us all to come home and to see so many people waving and cheering for us! I hope that the success we have achieved helps to inspire those younger than us to always work hard for what you want, because we have proved that hard work pays off. Finally, a big thank you to our coaches (two of whom are former Netherhall School students), as we wouldn't be where we are today without them. I would also like to thank our school for being so supportive and allowing us to go!" **Lucy Scott, year 13.**

UKMT Junior Mathematical Challenge

Every year the best mathematicians in UK schools are entered for the UKMT Mathematical Challenge. There are 25 multiple choice questions designed to test problem solving and reasoning skills, many of which would challenge confident GCSE students and adults!

In April, our biggest cohort ever sat the Junior Mathematical Challenge – 108 pupils across years 7 and 8. The results this year were outstanding. In year 7 there were 11 pupils achieving a Bronze Award and 2 pupils achieving a Silver Award. Matthew Underwood scored 72 points; achieving Best in Year alongside his silver award. In year 8, there were 9 pupils who achieved a bronze award, 3 pupils achieving a silver award and one pupil who scored an exceptional 97 points. As a result, Rileigh Sutton receives a Gold Award, Best In School and she qualifies for the Junior Kangaroo competition with her score. Entry to this competition is by invitation only for the highest achievers in the Junior Mathematical Challenge nationwide.

Well done to all of our year 7 and 8 students who took part in this competition, you should be very proud of your achievements.

Bronze Duke of Edinburgh Award

On Tuesday 2nd and Wednesday 3rd May, seventeen year 9 students successfully completed their Duke of Edinburgh Bronze Award expedition in a very warm and sunny Borrowdale valley. The students worked superbly together across the two days, combining their walking, navigating, camping and cooking skills as a group, with excellent demonstrations of teamwork, resilience and organisation on show. Every student was a credit to the school, displaying a positive attitude and excellent behaviour throughout the expedition.



On the first day of the expedition, the students started with a challenging ascent up Walla Crag, which tested the students' mental and physical resilience. Once the students had summited Walla Crag, they then carried on along their route towards the overnight campsite at Rosthwaite, taking in the views at Ashness Bridge, Surprise View and Watendlath, before eventually arriving at the Chapel Farm campsite for a well-deserved rest. Once they had reached the campsite, the students again displayed excellent resilience and organisation to arrange their tents and cook high quality meals before resting up after a challenging day of walking. The attitude and behaviour of the students was impeccable around the campsite, with several members of the public praising the students for their fantastic conduct and behaviour across the expedition.

The students started early on the second day of the expedition, sorting out their breakfasts, rucksacks and tents before planning the days route. Once underway, each group was tested in their navigation skills along a complicated route back to Keswick, with the students displaying vigilance and excellent teamwork to continue on course to finish in Portinscale. Despite the extremely warm conditions, the students managed the heat and the walk excellently together, taking in the views of Cat Bells, Derwentwater, Grange and Keswick along the way. Again, the students picked up several compliments along the route on the second day in terms of their conduct, manners and behaviour and then finished at the beautiful Nicol End marina to conclude their expedition.



Good, regular attendance and punctuality is expected of every student. Students should be in school by 8.30am each morning and be lined up quietly outside their registration room or assembly by 8.30am. Punctuality is an important part of self discipline and is essential to good time management. All lateness is recorded and sanctions given. If a student arrives AFTER 8.55am he/she will need to register with Mrs Telford in her office.

Netherhall School operates a **colour band system** to encourage and reward good attendance and to closely monitor and address poor attendance, in liaison with Children's Services and the County Inclusion Officer where necessary.

We ask that parents:

* do not make dental/medical appointments during school time where possible or to ensure their child attends part of the day where they can - dental/medical appointments cards or letters will be required

* not take holidays during term-time - the Headteacher cannot grant a leave of absence except in exceptional circumstances

* contact school straight away if your child is feeling unwell - this must be done **EACH DAY OF ABSENCE** to ensure students are safeguarded

It is the discretion of the school whether a student is sent home or any absence authorised.

Parents, students and governors will be regularly informed throughout the year of how well students are doing.

Our attendance governor is Julie Walton and she can be contacted through the Clerk to the Governors at school. She will be supporting the school with attendance interviews for students with attendance below 95%.

STATISTICS TO THINK ABOUT:

- * 95% attendance (1 day off every four weeks) gives students an 80% chance of achieving 5 A*-C grades at GCSE.
- * For every 10% drop in attendance, a student is likely to achieve 1 less GCSE
- * 90% attendance (1 day off per fortnight) gives students a 60% chance of achieving 5 A*-C grades at GCSE.
- * 85% attendance (1.5 days off per fortnight) gives students a 42% chance of achieving 5 A*-C grades at GCSE.
- * 80% attendance all the way through school is the equivalent of missing a whole year of education.
- * 80% attendance means a student is missing 1 full day of education every week.

What do we do to improve attendance at Netherhall School?

- Liaison with the Local Authority Inclusion Officer - Julie Topping (as and when required - ongoing)
- Liaison with Assistant Head regarding attending TAF, Core Group or involvement of external services

STUDENTS WITH CHRONIC ATTENDANCE (RED BAND: 90% OR LESS)

- HOY intervention (ongoing, as and when required)
- Communication via Edulink warning of poor attendance and possible consequences (as and when required)
- Headteacher's warning letter of legal consequences of ongoing poor attendance (as and when required)
- Involvement from the Local Authority Inclusion Officer - Julie Topping (as and when required - ongoing)
- Involvement with other external agencies e.g. Social Care, CAMHS where appropriate (as and when required)
- Early Help intervention (as and when required, reviewed in TAF (every 6-8 weeks)
- Attendance Review Conferences attended by Julie Topping, Attendance Officer and Assistant Headteacher (attendance) (3 weekly)
- Issuing of fixed penalty notices (as and when required)
- Legal procedures activated by the Local Authority, including interviews under caution and legal prosecution (as and when required)

The importance of being on time for school



DID YOU KNOW...

- Your child's learning starts as soon as they enter the classroom in the morning
- If your child is 5 minutes late each day, they miss 25 minutes of learning each week
- Over a 6-week term, this adds up to 150 minutes, or two and a half hours, of lost learning time
- Over the whole year (39 weeks), this totals 975 minutes - or over 16 hours - of missed education!
